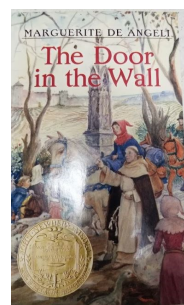
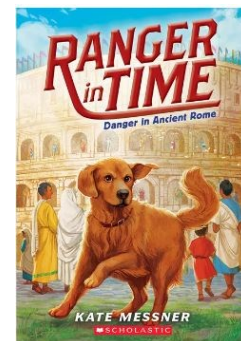
WHAT THE MAPLE TREE GIVES Written by Erin Giles, Illustrated by Lyndsay Picillo

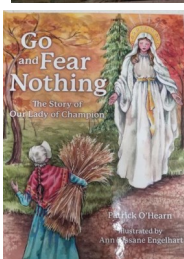
RANGER in TIME by Kate Messner

The Door in the Wall by Marguerite De Angeli

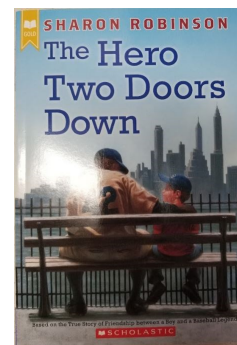

Marian apparitions are appearances of the Blessed Virgin Mary, coming down from heaven to earth, to one or more people. In 1859, Mary appeared three times to a young woman named Adele Brise on the Wisconsin frontier. Adele froze in her tracks at the sight of a beautiful woman, clothed in dazzling white, with a yellow sash around her waist.
